Interestingly, many CGs volunteered to intercede onsite in a separate prayer room for the pre-believers, while the sessions were ongoing. Seeing Nick, a young man who worships in Momentum, serving faithfully in the Alpha committee for the second year warmed my heart beyond words.

What do I see? I see Covenanters rising up to be a blessing. I see Covenanters sacrificing their time to invest in God's Kingdom. In my words of appreciation to the Alpha committee, I thanked them for leading so courageously and for bringing Alpha to the next level. But more than that, I shared with them that they did not just touch the 12 souls who prayed to receive Christ, they have also influenced their generation. Because when one steps from the dominion of darkness into God's Kingdom, his or her generation will be blessed too.

Let's continue to be a blessing and invest in the things that really matter!

Why Dads Are Irreplaceable

SCRIPTURE: TOPICAL - SERMON: PS BENJAMIN LEE

Introduction

Fathers bring different assets to parenting than mothers. – Kyle Pruett, Yale Medical School Dads parent differently. There are some things only a dad can do for his kids. Not having a dad around leaves emotional gaps that are hard to define, and come out differently in each individual. There are three reasons why dads are irreplaceable:

A. Masculine Input (Genesis 1:27)

Dads give us the distinctly masculine parental input.

- 1. This starts at creation. God created us in His image (Gen 1:27). The image of God is reflected in the male and female. God creates male and female differences for oneness. It takes both male and female to reflect God. Kids see God's love in dad and mom's love.
- 2. Dad is a guy and mom is a lady. Why mom and dad parent differently stems from the differences in how men and women are wired. Our kids get holistic parenting, full-complement of both parental input and love.
- 3. Dads provide a look at the world of men. A dad offers his daughter a safe avenue to experience her first male-female relationship. Boys have their masculinity affirmed. Moms cannot bestow masculinity on a young man.

B. Calling Forth Identity (Matthew 3:17)

Who am I? Why am I here? Many spend a lifetime searching for identity and purpose in life. Dads can make a big difference here.

- 1. Adam as the first human dad had a special calling to name and affirm identity (Gen 2:19-20; 3:20).
- 2. The second Adam, Christ was affirmed by his Dad (Matt 3:17).
- 3. Our heavenly Father gives spiritual gifts to each of us. This is Kingdom capital for our life assignment. We do need guidance to find our calling. Our earthly dads help us locate our identity and become who God intended us to be.

C. Discipleship (Ephesians 6:4)

Pastors are not the primary disciplemakers of our children. Christian discipleship is meant to happen primarily in the home. For the early Christians, the home was church.

- 1. Dads and moms are the primary disciplemakers of their children (Deut 6:2; 11:19). The discipleship of children and grandchildren is the responsibility and privilege of the parents. The church is our lifelong partner to disciple our young.
- 2. Fathering includes discipleship (Eph 6:4). Love Jesus with all of your life. Your kids and grandkids will love what you love.
- 3. Joshua was a dad and a granddad (Josh 24:15). He was fully devoted to lead his family and extended family to follow and serve the Lord wholeheartedly.

Conclusion

Moms and dads are not interchangeable because moms don't father and dads don't mother. Moms and dads bring different strengths to parenthood. Whatever job dads have, there are other people out there who can do it as well as us, but your role as a dad to your children is irreplaceable.
