Global God, Global Disciple

Go and make disciples of **all nations** (Matthew 28:19a)! This call for all disciples to be discipling is clear. The scope of Matthew 28 is **all nations** which means Global. Christ died on the cross and shed His blood to cleanse the sins of all mankind!

Our response thus cannot be less than the scope of this command in Matthew 28. In our 21 Jul Devotional Journal reading, John Piper in his book "Let the Nations be Glad" told a story about two ocean liners sinking at the same time.

We have limited resources and are not able to save both liners at the same time. Which ocean liner will we send the lifeboats to? From the position of fruitfulness and efficiency, one will send all the lifeboats to the nearer ocean liner. John Piper suggests that God's view may differ. God will send the lifeboats to both ocean liners! Because the Gospel is to reach

all nations! I believe all of us can participate in missions in many ways.

The simplest way is through prayer. Do join us in prayer that Covenant EFC and Singapore churches will be sending-churches. Collected data from Singapore Centre of Global Missions shows that since 2004, the number of missionaries sent out is getting lesser and lesser from year to year.

Second is to support the missionaries by giving financially, praying for them, helping to look after their parents, and encouraging them with letters and visits.

Third is to go to the harvest field!

Learn about the four roles a Global Disciple can take on; go to the foyer and find out more!

This year's Missions week serves to highlight Business As Missions (BAM). Do come to the BAM workshops on 27 Jul and 2 Aug to learn and be inspired!

SERMON OUTLINE

How to Best Help the Poor

SCRIPTURE: TOPICAL ■ SERMON: DR LAVAL YAU

Matthew 26:6-13; Mark 14:3-9 and John 12:1-8

These passages will be looked at from the point of view of how to best help the poor.

1. Incident takes place in Simon the Leper's home.
2. Apostles (Judas mainly) wanted to feed the poor.
3. Jesus replied that the poor will always be with us.

What we can learn about helping the poor from these passages:

1. Check how much we really care about the poor (Lk 14:12-14)
How close have you been to the poor lately?
2. Deuteronomy 15:4-11 gives us the ways we should care for the poor. Rate yourself on each one of them, 1 being lowest and 10 being highest:
 - a. Do not be hard-hearted 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10
 - b. Do not be tight-fisted 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10
 - c. Rather be open-handed 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10
 - d. Freely lend what is needed 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10
 - e. Harbour no wicked (scheming) thought 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10
 - f. Give generously 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10
 - g. Without a grudging heart 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10
3. Once you have given and given, how do you combat compassion fatigue, disillusion and disappointment with helping the poor?
4. The anointing of Jesus prepares him for His death. We preach Christ crucified (1 Cor 1:22-23). Christ Crucified comes first.
5. Come and rest at the feet of Jesus (Matt 11:28) then see Him in the poor.

LAST WEEK'S SERMON SUMMARY

What It Takes to Finish Well

SCRIPTURE: EZRA 6:13 –15 ■ SERMON: PS LEE DA WIN

Introduction

The rebuilding of the Temple restarted in 536 BC, and was stalled for 16 years. God sent Haggai and Zechariah to encourage them to restart the work in 520 BC, and in today's text, four years since rebuilding restarted, the rebuilding of the Temple is finally completed.

There are three lessons from today's text about finishing well.

A. God Opens the Door — Be Prepared

1. God turned around what appeared to be a challenge of the Jews' authority, totally transforming the landscape after decades of opposition and discouragement, enabling their work to be totally unhindered.
2. God is the One who opens the door, enabling the Jews to finish the work that He had called them to start.
3. Our response: Be prepared to walk in when God opens the door. In this season of prayer, prepare by participating in the 40 Days for Our Nation, for what God is about to do to transform the spiritual landscape of the nation.

B. God Inspires the Heart — BE PASSIONATE

1. The elders of the Jews built and prospered (6:14), (cf. 5:1-2, Zerubbabel and Jeshua arose and began to rebuild) as a direct result of the support received from Haggai and Zechariah.
2. God is the One who sends His servants to inspire our hearts when we are in need of encouragement, He does so both by admonishment (Haggai) and exhortation (Zechariah).
3. Our response: Be passionate about whatever it is that God has called us to do. Whatever that may be, let's do it with all our heart, as unto the Lord!

C. God Sets the Clock — BE PATIENT

1. Rebuilding was completed in the sixth year of the reign of Darius (516 BC). This is exactly 70 years since the destruction of the Temple in 586 BC and fulfills the prophecies of Jeremiah 25:11-12; 29:10.
2. God's timing is perfect. What may appear to be a delay to us is in fact, part of God's divine plan.
3. Our response: Since it is God who sets the clock, we need to be patient, and adjust ourselves to move according to His divine timetable instead of our own.

Conclusion

The rebuilding work of the temple may have been finished, but God still had unfinished business. The Greater Temple – Jesus – was yet to come! The Temple represents the presence of God with His people, and this was to point to Jesus (Emmanuel – God with us) who came as the Son of Man. Do we have unfinished business with God today? Maybe you need Jesus to open a door, or to inspire your heart, or you need to reset your clock according to His. Respond to Jesus.
