ingaporeans have just celebrated the 52nd National Day. On Tuesday night, Covenanters from all three centres came together at our WDL Centre for our National Day Prayer. We worshipped as one church family and interceded for our nation with many insights shared by our guest speaker, Mr Richard Magnus. On Wednesday evening, as my family and I watched the National Day Parade live on TV, a feeling of pride came over me. I am glad to be a Singaporean and thankful to God for our nation. It is a small country, but it is our own — a place we can truly call home. There is something unique about it. Singapore has a special combination of places, people, public institutions, local cuisines, local languages and multi-cultural flavour.

We must never think we built this nation by our own intelligence and strength. We must acknowledge God in all our achievements and recognise that it is by His grace that we have done many good things. Indeed, God has greatly blessed us with able and dedicated leaders, and a cohesive and hardworking people through the past five decades.

As we move into the future, even while we work hard to innovate

and pursue economic growth, we must also work hard to guard against many threats: the breakdown of marriages and families, moral decay and erosion of shared values, self-centred individualism and social apathy, mistrust between different racial and religious groups, and external threats to our sovereignty and security. A Life Dedicated

SCRIPTURF: F7RA 6:16-18 ■ SFRMON: PS FDMUND WONG

Introduction

Jesus the King is looking for those who would go beyond lip service and clichés, to be a people fully dedicated to Him. So that we shine brightly in the end-time darkness! Verse 16 – Dedication to God involves both consecration (cleansing from sin, separation from the world) and conditioning (lifestyle, values and behaviours that keep and strengthen our consecration).

Our conditioned dedication to God is visible through:

A. A Life Marked by Joy (v.16)

- a. Their joy at the temple dedication was a crescendo of the joy they began at the rebuilding of the altar, and the laying of the temple foundation (Ezr 3:10-13).
- b. 2 Chronicles 7:8-10 the joy at the dedication of the first temple was God-ward, remembering the blessings He had given.

Focus: Joy is possible in the midst of pain, loss, uncertainties and challenges. It is possible when we have rituals to trace God's hand of goodness. Establish them!

B. A Worship Seen in Sacrifice (v.17)

- a. 1 Kings 8:62-63 like the dedication of the first temple, animals were sacrificed as burnt and peace offerings. Though much less this time round (700 compared to 142,000) due to the much smaller population and resources available.
- b. But there was one offering not made at the dedication of the first temple sin offerings for the 12 tribes, even when only three tribes returned (Ezr 1:5). The people were finally atoning for the sins (idolatry, oppression) of their nation, since the destruction of the first temple 70 years ago. For a fresh start and new journey!

Focus: God doesn't need our sacrifice. But we do! Without sacrifice, our faith is the same, lame and tame. With it, something unlocks in our soul. Our National Day prayer (8 Aug) is a minute sacrifice we are making together.

C. A Way Set in Obedience (v.18)

- a. Priests and Levites were divided into 24 groups to serve at the temple, one week each time, twice a year. It was King David who instituted this system.
- b. But it was Moses who established their calling and consecration. David refined their roles and responsibilities when the Tabernacle era was over.

Focus: God often directs us through our leaders. Our obedience to God is tested by our obedience to them. Let our default response to leaders be "yes", rather than "no" when approached. Unless there are serious reasons and reservations beyond discomfort, unreadiness or inadequacy.

Conclusion

The cross is the place where dedication begins. Not with our dedication to God, but God's dedication to us!
