### EFC Asia: Together for His Glory!

About 270 folks gathered in Kuala Lumpur from 20 to 23 September 2017 for our 10th EFC Asia Conference 2017. Covenant EFC is part of a denomination called the Evangelical Free Church of Singapore (EFCS). EFCS in turn is part of Evangelical Free Church of Asia (EFC Asia) which consists of five Asian countries: Japan, China/Hong Kong, Philippines, Malaysia and Singapore. These are the countries where the EFC America churches sent missionaries to plant churches.

This year, the theme was "Bridging the Generation Gap". Two keynote speakers, a younger pastor (Rev Jayson Tham, Yan Fook EFC, Hong Kong) and a senior statesman pastor (Ps Daniel Ho, Founding Pastor DUMC, KL), shared their insights and experiences which encouraged us to press on in our endeavour to reach out, grow and develop the next generation for the Kingdom!

As the Chairman of the EFC Asia Committee, I was privileged to witness two special things that happened at this year's conference. Firstly, there is a growing trust and friendship among the EFC Asia Steering Committee. In the past, our representatives would meet once every four years for the purpose of getting the conferences going. Such infrequent contacts and

the recurrent change of country chairman did not allow for deeper conversations to know one another better. But God has been doing something new! Since 2011, He has orchestrated the EFC Asia Steering Committee to meet every year for various reasons. Along with the continuity of current EFC Asia country leadership, this has led to the deepening of trust and friendship. We believe this mutual love and honour is pleasing to the Lord, and by this all men will know that we are His disciples (Jn 13:34-35).

Secondly, the EFC America President, Rev Kevin Kompelien, flew all the way from America to join us just for this conference. As far as I am aware, this was the first time any EFC America President joined our conferences. I see this as a deliberate effort on the part of EFC America to re-engage with the EFC Asia countries. The timing is divine as EFC Asia is now maturing together as a team.

I see God's hand uniting our five Asian countries in mutual love and trust. For me, this forms a truer and deeper foundation for partnership and mission. God is also leading EFC America for deeper engagement this season. God's hand is over us to unite us for the Kingdom. May we live for a larger purpose and grow together for His glory!

## LAST WEEK'S SERMON SUMMARY

### “Are You with ME?”

SCRIPTURE: EZRA 8:1-14 ■ SERMON: PS SHARON FONG

#### A. A Discipleship That's Born Out of God's Covenant Faithfulness

1. Ezra 8:1-14 is just a list of names, but they are not ordinary names. They are names of leading men / heads of families.
2. The list of names shows 12 families. They signify the reunification of the 12 tribes of Israel. The 12 families represent a complete picture of the 12 tribes of Israel. It gives us a sense of God's covenant faithfulness to His people throughout history. Even in the second wave, close to a gap of 58 years from chapter 6, God has not forgotten the covenant He made to His people. He is reconstituting Israel in the Promised Land.
3. Are you facing a “gap” in your discipleship journey? This “gap” refers to a waiting period. It does not represent a break in God's faithfulness. The names of the 12 families reminds us of God's constant faithfulness throughout history. Scholars call this name list a theme of continuity. Interestingly, God uses it to tutor our perspective when we face a “gap” in our lives. A “gap” is not meant to break our faith, but to deepen our understanding of God's faithfulness. It is not meant to hinder us, but to define us.
4. God is faithful. He never left us and never will.

#### B. A Discipleship That Walks with God in Covenant Obedience

1. Ezra 8:1 - These courageous leaders and families were “with Ezra”. They made a choice to return with a purpose — to restore the law of God in Jerusalem. Such a tall order! Maybe that was why only about 5,000 people returned, unlike the 50,000 in the first wave of return. They showed radical discipleship and made a choice to walk with God in covenant obedience.
2. Today, we must make a choice to be radical in our discipleship and to return to a holy life. Someone once said, “God gives us two gifts: one is choice, the other is chance.” With both the choice and chance we have in life, we must walk in covenant obedience to Him. Choose to be with God. We need to make that little choice today and we will be surprised how it will impact our future. Choose to be with God.

#### Conclusion

1. God is faithful. He never left us and never will. But God is asking us: “Are you with Me? Are you fully with Me? Are you living a double life?” We need to choose to be with God because He never left us and never will.
2. The storms in life are not meant to deter us, but to define us. God uses even the storms to push His sovereign plan for our lives. Nothing can stand between God and us, not even storms. Trust in God's faithfulness again and make that choice to be with Him. Choose to be with Him because He never left you and never will. Make the right choice even in the midst of a storm. When you look back years later, you will never regret.
