Let Us Prepare Our Hearts

oday is Palm Sunday.
More than 2,000
years ago, Jesus
entered into Jerusalem to a red
carpet reception by the Jewish
crowd. They had expected
Him to deliver them from
their political and military
oppressors. They cried out to
Him, "Save us! Save us!" They
were yearning for their long
overdue freedom and thought
it was finally here!

What a dramatic climax it would have been if He marched straight to the Roman governmental building, stared at Pontius Pilate in the eye and like Moses said, "Let My people go!" But instead, he went to the Temple. What he did was unexpected and unbecoming of a rabbi creating havoc in the Temple grounds and stopping people from their religious status quo. Imagine the tables flipping, the coins sliding to the ground, and the doves flying into the air!

What was wrong with Jesus? Everything in the Temple was going on "just fine!". Or so they thought. He saw beyond the outward forms, no matter how good they looked. "My

house shall be called a house of prayer. But you have made it a den of thieves." He saw into the heart. Religion had been used for personal gain. No wonder Jesus declared that His people were like the fig tree in the city – barren and withered. And He wept for their state and their fate to come (Matt 21:1-19, Lk 19:1-46).

This week leading up to Good Friday and Easter is a God-given opportunity for our self-reflection. What is the true condition of our hearts that nobody fully sees? As one Covenant EFC pastor put it, what keeps us awake at night is what we really worship. If I may add, what we often ask in prayer reveals whether our motivations are self-centred or God-centred.

May God in His grace reveal our hearts for what they are and what He sees. So that as a church, we may truly pray and repent, and become spiritually fruitful again to the Father's glory. Let us prepare our hearts as we come together in prayer this Maundy Thursday, 8pm at WDL Centre. Have a blessed Holy Week!

The Case for Marriage

SCRIPTURE: TOPICAL • SERMON: SEAN MCDOWELL

Introduction

The values of fluid gender, same-sex marriage and subjective truth have flooded the minds and shaped the worldview of the next generation in America. These ideas are on the shores of Singapore. Therefore, we need to be biblically equipped on the issues.

A. The Biblical Case for Marriage

- 1. In Genesis 1:27, God reveals Himself as a Creator. Since we are created beings, it implies that we have a purpose. If there was no God, then we would have no purpose.
- 2. God's command to the man and woman is to be fruitful and multiply.
- 3. God created people in His image, he created them male and female.
- 4. In Genesis 2:24, the command is for man to leave his father and mother and become one flesh with his wife. What does it mean to become one flesh?
 - a. Oneness in every way relationally, physically, emotionally and financially.
- b. Oneness biologically. We can perform every biological function by ourselves except for sex.
- c. God's design was one man, for one woman, for one life time, and to populate the earth.
- 5. In Matthew 19:3-4, when the Pharisees asked Jesus about the issue of divorce, Jesus pointed them back to Genesis 1 God made them male and female, and then Genesis 2:24 man is to leave his father and mother to become one flesh with his wife. Reason being that Jesus wanted to remind them that it was one man, one woman, for one lifetime.
- 6. When Jesus spoke about issues of sexuality, he was more conservative.
- 7. When our worldview lines up with Jesus' worldview, we are always on the right side of history.

B. Case for Marriage Without the Bible

- 1. Same sex marriage is not the root of the problem; it is the fruit of the problem.
- 2. Broken heterosexual marriages have done more damage in our lives than same sex marriages have.
- 3. Sexual revolution states that:
 - a. Sex is divorced from babies. It is a purely physical act.
- b. Marriage is about self-fulfillment. Marriage is about finding your soul mate.
- c. Gender differences are irrelevant: "Gender is between your ears, not between your legs."
- 4. If we adopt these ideas on the sexual revolution then same sex marriage makes sense.
- 5. However, the original design for sex states that: Sex makes babies; society needs babies; babies need a mother and father. Studies have all shown that the optimal environment for a healthy self-image is for a child to have a mother and a father.

C. What Can We Do?

- 1. Repent. Work on our personal relationship with God, and on our marriages.
- 2. Help the next generation to see through the lies and the manipulation that is spreading through the wider culture.
- 3. Teach a positive view of the Bible, that sex is a gift.
